

Lab Drawings

It is often helpful to draw what is observed after completing an experiment. On the previous page is a blank lab sheet to duplicate. Below find an outline of what should be included in your drawings. Do not limit yourself to the outline below. Include as much details as necessary. It is often necessary for your scientific method to be 3-4 pages long. I recommend using the science experiment outline that is left blank, or make one of your own, for the older grades. Following are more pages to use for labeling, drawing, and note-booking your observations.

Sample Drawing Observation

Name of object you are drawing goes here, including any additional information such as the scientific name.

Drawing of the object goes here, including details of what you have observed.

Draw lines from the observed object to the lines on the right, where you will label your drawing.

Empty rectangular box for a title or header.

Series of horizontal lines for writing.

Large empty rectangular box for a drawing or illustration.

Series of horizontal lines for writing, continuing from the top section.
